Curriculum Vitae

On Oct 2nd 2005, in the presence of the Hon'ble President of India, Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, the Mahindra Group took a pledge - a Pledge for Affirmative Action.

Despite 15 years of economic reforms, youth from socially and economically disadvantaged communities had not found adequate representation in the roster of organised private sector companies in India Inc. This was particularly alarming given that 65% of India's population was below the age of 35 years and the much touted 'demographic dividend' was threatening to become a liability for the nation. In this background, the Mahindra Group entrusted Naandi Foundation with the task of designing and implementing a programme that would skill and create jobs for disadvantaged youth.

Under the 'Mahindra Pride Schools' banner, Naandi designed a framework for creating jobs in the organised sector for unemployed youth from underprivileged backgrounds. The programme involved mobilising and enrolling youth from slums and low-income communities for a 90-day non-residential

course. Apart from the compulsory 'life-skills' module consisting of English proficiency, digital literacy, grooming and personality development, the programme offered a specialised elective for specific sectors such as ITES, Retail, Hospitality, and Automobile. The tailor-made curriculum was created by working in close consultation with the industry and this resulted in every student getting a job offer as soon as they completed the course. In other words, every student who 'graduated' from the Mahindra Pride School got a confirmed full-time corporate job!

Naandi designed a three-step programme. First, they mobilised underprivileged and unemployed youth; skilled them for 90 days and placed them in companies in the formal sector with a full-time job that fetched the proverbial five-figure salary per month. Starting with the first Mahindra Pride School in Pune, the programme expanded to 8 more Schools located in Chennai, Patna, Chandigarh, Srinagar, Hyderabad and Varanasi. These schools ensured a record 100% placement for their students.

Seeing that Naandi had cracked the 'job guarantee' formula by 2016, an asset-light version of the programme was innovated to spread this magic curriculum to over 1000 locations across India. The new framework created Mahindra Pride Classrooms inside a chosen network of vocational schools like ITIs, polytechnics, and government degree colleges. This collaboration allowed 'the conveyor belt' of job-creation to spread to 17 states in India and impact over a quarter million youth.

On Oct 2nd 2020, as the Mahindra Group completes 75 years of its existence, it is a matter of pride to report that 100,000 unemployed youth have got gainful employment in the organised sector in India in the last 15 years. It is indeed humbling to look back upon the fact and see that we far surpassed our own expectations of a promise made 15 years ago. The Mahindra Pride School programme has become a veritable Job Factory by metamorphosing youth who were unskilled and deemed 'unemployable' to a career in the organised sector.

This has been transformative for the dignity and economic status of their families impacting close to half million lives.

The students of Mahindra Pride School seemed to represent the various faces of adversity – extreme indebtedness of parents; orphaned at a young age or raised by a single parent; tortured by domestic violence; victims of substance abuse; and such other hardships of broken lives that could only be fixed by a sustained livelihood. It required an extraordinarily innovative (read emotive) curriculum to transform the minds of these students from despair to hope.

This book tells 75 stories of how the harshness of the ovarian lottery was reversed and how a new course of life, or curriculum vitae in Latin, was charted.

Nuts & Bolts

When dispossessed, underprivileged youth from fractured backgrounds and labelled as 'unemployable' are schooled for the second time around, what is the magic sauce in the curriculum required to ensure they transform, learn new skills and be job-ready? This is the million-dollar question that the team at Naandi Foundation faced in order to fulfil the promise of affirmative action made by the Mahindra Group to the nation. After getting proximate with the youth, lending them ears and shoulders, the solution seemed very simple. It became evident that by developing self-belief through unconditional trust and confidence in the youth it was possible to upskill and land them jobs in the formal sector. Tightening the nuts & bolts would do the trick!

This book uniquely chronicles 75 profiles in courage by highlighting the triumphs of the youth and not their string of failures. The course of their life before enrolment into the Mahindra Pride Schools is depicted in black and white sketches – almost like a fading silhouette of a past they wish to forget. Their present is highlighted in colour photographs

to celebrate how they rewrote their destiny. We have left out the tears of joy and gratitude these students expressed while paying tribute to the extraordinary team of their 'teachers' or 'soul doctors' who proved that empathy, compassion, and unconditional love still exists and can transform anyone any time. In the spirit of carrying out acts of selfless service, the faculty shall remain unnamed.
